Dear Parents,

The children have been working hard and have now settled into a good routine in KS2.

In maths, the children have secured their written methods for subtraction and are moving onto working with 3 digit numbers. They are beginning to use the inverse operation to check their answer is correct. I have set some maths homework this week, which continues the work completed in class.

The children have enjoyed reading 'Stone Age Boy' and learning about the various jobs the people had to undertake each day to survive. We thought about speech this week and how to use inverted commas correctly. This will be covered frequently during SPaG sessions throughout the year. The children are getting used to a longer English session. They are re-capping previous learning from Year 2 to ensure they use good sentence structure, building on sentences to make them more interesting.

In PE, we continued to learn how to play a game of netball and I am pleased to see so many boys have signed up for my lunchtime club.

The children are bringing home their spellings books on Friday with the first set of words to learn for next Friday. I am encouraging them to write their words, we also practise them during hand-writing sessions, which should give the children a good start at learning them. Please remind your child to bring their books back in for the test every Friday, to enable us to give out the next set of spellings. You will also be able to see how they did.

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Please remember we have 'Forest School' next Friday. Our 'Stone Age Day' will be on Monday 9th October. Should the children wish to dress up, they can. The children will taste stewed berries; please let me know if this will pose a problem for your child.
