For English, we watched clips from the film 'Where the Wild Things are.' We saw Max sail off to his own dream world and imagined what our own fantasy dream worlds would look like. We drew and wrote descriptive sentences about our imaginary places. Then we created our own 'Wild Things' creature and described their features and special powers the creature had.

In English, we also looked at singular and plural words. We learnt when to add -s or -es to the end of the noun to make it plural.

We read a story called 'Mrs Armitage on Wheels,' about a lady who customises her bike very creatively. We used Mrs Armitage for inspiration to help us design our own moon buggies.

In maths, we looked at fractions. We found halves and quarters of different shapes, thinking about how sometimes we can halve and quarter some shapes in more than just one way. Then we found halves and quarters of quantities by sharing objects into two or four groups.

For our plants topic in science, we carried out an investigation to see if the plants with the longest leaves also have the longest roots. We measured the leaves and roots of various plants, recorded our results on a graph and drew conclusions from our results.



Today we had forest school. On our way to the woods, we collected leaves, flowers and sticks and stuck them on some sticky tape to show the different parts of our journey. We read 'Where the Wild things are' with Mrs Murray and created our own

boats, feasts and masks from all the materials we found in the woods.
