



Dear Parents,

In maths, the children have been measuring in centimetres and millimetres, using a ruler. They added various measurements together, including those that were not in whole centimetres. The children understood that they could use their addition written method, or use a mental method, taking care to ensure they converted the millimetres where appropriate.

This week in English, the children looked at the fictional lion in 'Narnia' and a real lion. They were comparing both and looking at their similarities and differences. This enabled the children to write a description about a real lion, using fact sheets and information they already knew.

As you can see from the picture, the children are continuing to look at shadows and how they are formed. They learnt that light travels in a straight line and shadows can change size and position depending on where the sun is at that time.

There are a lot of children saying they don't have their PE kit with them, or that they do not have the correct shoes to go outside in. We do try to check, but as you can appreciate, this is very difficult to do with 30 children. We like to encourage them to be independent in KS2; otherwise a large portion of the lesson can be spent finding missing clothing. It would be great if over the holidays you could check your child's PE kit, as some are also mentioning about shoes being too small.
