In maths, the children learnt all about Roman numerals. They are able to recognise that this is a numerical system, formed in the Roman era. The children could tell me that it is still used today on clocks, or to indicate chapters in books. We focused on telling the time using Roman numeral clocks, which wasn't easy! By the end of the week, the children were able to recognise symbols representing numbers up to 1000. They could also use these symbols to represent years, such as 1975!

This week in English, we focused on reading and comprehension. The children completed comprehension sheets about Narnia and 'James and the Giant Peach!' Mrs Patterson and I are trying to hear as many children read as possible over the next few days; we have been very impressed with their improvement.
