Dear Parents and Carers,

First of all, thank you all for attending parents' evening this week – it was lovely to see you and catch up on your children's progress.

For English this week, we started by describing all of the wonderful fireworks we had seen at the weekend. We described how they looked, moved and the sounds they made.

We also began reading a story this week about a little barn owl called Plop, who is afraid of the dark. We learnt lots of facts about barn owls and wrote some of the information we learnt in our books. We discussed why they are nocturnal animals and how they use their super senses of hearing and sight to hunt at night.

In Maths, we have been working on counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. During our lessons, we have been listening to lots of different songs to help us to count in the different multiples. We then looked at 100 squares and counted in jumps of 2, 5 and 10, colouring in all of the numbers that we landed on. We are now becoming more confident with counting in the multiples.

This week in Art, we have been using our story of 'The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark' to create images of owls. We went onto the playground and collected different coloured leaves to use as the wings for the owl. By the end of the lesson, we had all drawn and coloured our own owls.

On Friday, we were learning about Remembrance Day. The children each wrote a thoughtful prayer for all the brave soldiers who fought for our country.
