We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all pupils. We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed. We believe that all pupils should benefit from the funding, regardless of their level of sporting ability. The most effective way to ensure a lasting and positive impact of the funding on PE provision throughout the school is to develop teachers' skill and confidence in the teaching of the subject.

Summary of SPG spending 2016/17

The Sports Premium Funding this year was used to specifically support the Physical Education curriculum, primarily through the improved provision of opportunities for outdoor and adventurous activity challenges, both individually and within a team. We appointed a fully trained and accredited Forest Schools' Practitioner to develop and lead a programme of outdoor and adventurous activity challenges, which was also followed by members of the teaching staff in order for them to further develop their skills and confidence in this area.

Future plans for PE provision:

Existing school staff to provide an increased range of outdoor and adventurous activity challenges.

Outcomes

Feedback from pupils and staff concerning the Forest School programme has been overwhelmingly positive. Teachers and support staff have commented that children who have not previously enjoyed traditional PE lessons engage well with the climbing and running elements of the activities and are keen to challenge themselves. Many children have expressed a desire for more Forest School sessions, with longer zip lines to use and more (higher) trees to climb. The impact on pupils' well being and self esteem will be monitored as we embed the programme in the coming academic year.
