

Year 1 Home Learning

Dear Parents and Carers,

In English this week, we have continued to read 'The Storm Whale' by Benji Davies. We have been thinking very carefully about the scenes within the book and using the text to help us to think about what might have happened. We were given a line from the text, that told us that the little boy, Noi, had gone out to explore what had been left behind after a great storm. We then thought about what Noi may see along the beach and wrote our own stories about what he found. We remembered that we needed to use capital letters, full stops and finger spaces to write super sentences.



In Maths, we have been learning how to order numbers from smallest to greatest in value. We learnt that we need to look at the tens digit within the number carefully, followed by the ones digit to find the value of each. We then used this to order the numbers correctly.

In Phonics this week, we have been learning about vowels. We now know that there are 5 vowels - a, e, i, o, u – and that they can have two different sounds. They can have a short sound and a long sound. The long sound uses the letter name. We practised find vowels in our names and then sorted words into the correct vowel type.

In Topic, we have continued our learning about the seaside. This week, we have been learning about entertainment at the seaside and how it has changed over the last 100 years. We have learnt that the entertainment has changed a great deal as in Victorian times, people would not sit on the beach and build sandcastles, they would go to the theatre to watch moving pictures.

We had a lot of fun at Forest School this week and we managed to get incredibly muddy! It was lovely to see that all of the children were having a lot of fun and were showing a great deal of teamwork and perseverance whilst playing.
