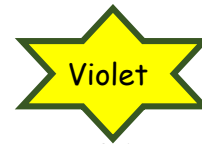


Year 6 news

Stars of the week

Forest school:

The children enjoyed their forest school session today. They spent time in the stream, made a fire, and climbed trees.

History:

The children continued learning about important dates from 1939 to 1945. They were tasked with devising questions for a class quiz, that we will use every week in our history lessons.

English:

This week, the children planned and wrote a non-chronological report about a dragon. They were challenged to use ambitious vocabulary, subordinating conjunctions, complex sentences and relative clauses. The children worked so hard and I am very pleased with the results. In SPaG, we re-capped how to use the apostrophe for possession and also the use of *a* and *an*.

Science:

The children carried out their investigation this week - **Do we need light to see?** They worked together in their groups and recorded the results, along with their conclusions.

Reading:

The children did a reading comprehension test this week. The area that proved difficult was inference and how to answer the inference questions. In order to become better at answering these kinds of questions, the children need to be reading good quality, challenging books regularly. Please encourage your son/daughter to read every day at home. Thanks for your support with this.

Maths:

We continued our work on common multiples. The reasoning questions provided a challenge for all children and it was interesting to see how they tried to solve the problems. We also learnt about prime numbers this week.

If your son/daughter is not confident with his/her times tables, please encourage the use of TT Rockstars at home. Most areas of maths in year 6 require a quick recall of all multiplication and division facts.
